## **Art Market San Francisco's 10th Edition Brings Art Community Together After Two Year Hiatus & Closes With Strong Sales**

**San Francisco, CA** - After a two year hiatus due to the pandemic, **Art Market San Francisco** was welcomed back by a dedicated and motivated audience of patrons excited by the robust collection of over 75 innovative and established modern and contemporary art galleries from the Bay Area and around the world that were featured at Fort Mason Center's Festival Pavilion from April 21st through the 24th.

Despite rain in the forecast, skies cleared for this 10th edition of the Bay Area's premier and longest-running art fair, which kicked off with an official proclamation from the City of San Francisco, recognizing Art Market San Francisco for its tradition and contributions to the city. This acknowledgement of the collaboration Art Market has had with the city's local arts community since its inception in 2011 ushered in an enthusiastic energy that resonated throughout the weekend, where exhibiting galleries reported a rejuvenated excitement resulting in productive engagement with both new and existing clientele and strong sales at a wide range of price points.

Over 20,000 avid collectors and art lovers attended Art Market San Francisco across the four days, taking in the elevated curation of impressive galleries and installations laid out throughout the fair's spacious, museum-quality set-up. Highlights included a vibrant large scale mural near the front entrance by **Avila Rose**, entitled **Give Me Life** (presented by [Part 2 Gallery](#)); **Mads Christensen's** gorgeous **Campfire** light installation (presented by [Timothy Yarger Fine Art](#)); **Marie Watt's Skywalker/Skyscraper (Forest)**, featuring towers of reclaimed blankets, reclaimed cedar and steel I-beams (presented by [Catharine Clark Gallery](#)); and [Creativity Explored's](#) **Mode Brut** fashion installation adjacent to the cafe, among many others.

In addition to absorbing the immense artistry throughout Fort Mason Center's Festival Pavilion, patrons enjoyed the return of Art Market's talks series. This year's panel conversations and presentations included [Creativity Explored's](#) engaging discussion on diversity and inclusiveness in fashion, in how, by and for whom it is created as a textile art form. [ArtTable's](#) all-female panel discussed how developments in the digital realm, including the ever-evolving

world of digital art, NFTs, and cryptocurrencies influence the established habits of art collectors, and [Oakland Art Murrur](#)'s distinguished curator, gallerist, arts entrepreneur and museum director panel discussed systemic barriers, as well as solutions, to equity in the arts.

Throughout the weekend, Art Market was pleased to host receptions and fair tours for a variety of cultural and corporate partners, including arts organization boards, wealth management clients, and tech company creatives.
